



An Infant-Toddler Assessment With Feeling; Up-to-Date Use of a Truly Comprehensive, Intervention-Based Assessment

With growing attention on increasing numbers of young children identified with mental health and behavioral concerns, it is essential to understand and assess the emergence of psychosocial development in very young children. In this session we look at indicators of the quality of a child's relationship to others, the range and quality of feelings or affects that are part of the developing child's emotional repertoire and coping behavior. To understand and utilize these indicators for intervention planning, it is necessary to observe and assess a child's ability to adapt and apply his/her capabilities and skills to meet the demands of daily living. We introduce the Infant–Toddler Developmental Assessment (IDA-2), which integrates social, emotional, and coping milestones into comprehensive global developmental assessment, with attention to parent report and health variables. (The original assessment was developed by Sally Provence, MD, and her colleagues at Yale.)
